# Prairie Brass Members Join Illinois Brass Band for their UK Tour

As Colin Holman and the Illinois Brass Band were preparing to tour Europe, not everyone in the band was able to go. Prairie Brass Band generously supplied three of the necessary subs: Christine Moore (cornet),

David Guion (tenor trombone), and Steve Larkin (Eb Bass). A former member of Prairie Brass Band, Vyvian Lawrence (percussion) also made the trip.

The tour began on June 16, 2000, when the band competed in the Saddleworth Whitfriday marching competitions.

Eleven villages near Manchester hosted separate competitions on that day. IBB was one of 138 bands! British-born Christine, a veteran of Saddleworth having participated on two previous occasions, performed a valuable service by registering IBB in the five events that we entered.

Over the next two weeks, we performed twelve concerts in the towns of Basingstoke, Newbury, Chester, Wigan, Leeds, Wakefield, and Norwich, as well as one in rural Norfolk. These concerts were evenly divided between formal concerts and concerts in schools. The band

> played forty different pieces, including David Guion's arrangement of "Chicago,

That Toddlin' Town".

The tour was not all musical labor. We all did a lot of touristy things and spent lots of money on souvenirs. Steve found a bass trombone in G. which, used to be the stan-

dard British bass trombone but is now rarely heard.

Overall, it was an memorable experience for everyone involved!

Smile! It's all in good fun (and your section may be next!)


